It has been yet another exciting week in Year 4!

Here are a few of the highlights

In English, our Year 4 students embarked on an exciting project: writing a newspaper report about an Indian monsoon. The focus was on honing their skills in direct and indirect speech, crucial elements in effective reporting.

In mathematics, Year 4 delved into the world of geometry. They explored various shapes, learning to identify and describe their properties. The focus was on understanding the characteristics of polygons, including triangles and quadrilaterals. They also learned about different types of angles—acute, obtuse, and right angles.

In history, our Year 4 students engaged in a fascinating project to create a timeline comparing the length of the Indus Valley Civilization to other significant periods in time such as the Anglo-Saxons, Romans, Ancient Greece, and Ancient Egypt. This activity allowed students to visualise the chronological span and historical overlap of these civilizations. They learned that the Indus Valley Civilization, thrived from around 3300 BCE to 1300 BCE. By constructing this timeline, students gained a deeper appreciation of the ancient world's complexity and the interconnections between different cultures across centuries.
