In reading this week the children have continued to answer retrieval and inference questions and have really got to grips with making sure they are using evidence from the text and explaining their answers which is a key skill for them to take into next term.

In Maths, the children have again shown great resilience and challenged themselves across both in class topics and arithmetic practice. The children's success rate is certainly improving and many are showing responsibility and independence when showing their workings out in lessons.

In science this week we have been looking at light. Children have conducted some fabulous experiments to understand how light can travel through transparent materials. In History the children have created some fantastic single page spreads as part of our World War Two topic. The children have been looking at the Blitz and The Holocaust and showcased their work which they are all very proud of.

In Computing the children have continued to work on their spreadsheets and have started to manipulate these to include calculations and total data using the correct operation. The children have really enjoyed taking their skills they've learnt to the next level and starting to produce some in depth data!
