The children have been working very hard on these letters and have shown great resilience with their writing this term and are starting to produce a greater quantity of writing as well as ensuring they are meeting the writing success criteria.

In reading the children have started a new book on the life of Noor Inayat Khan, the last wireless operator in Paris. The children have really engaged with this book and will be practising retrieving and drawing inferences from the text.

Year 6 have completed the planning and designing process for their motor powered boats ready to make after the half term. We have seen some very creative and innovative designs that we look forward to coming to life!

In Religious studies we have finished off their double page spread looking at Hinduism this week and their views on peace, conflict and why conflict should be avoided. In French we have learnt how to correctly say numbers 1 to 10 and a range of colours. The children have put this into practice based on a number of different scenarios.

In science Year 6 have been working scientifically and conducting further investigations on how the length of a wire can affect the brightness of a bulb, considering a clear and concise method, and drawing conclusions based on their extensive practical results.
