

Year 6 Blog – Week Commencing 13.03.23: Preparing for disaster, progressive and perfect tense and measure!

In English, we have started our writing to persuade topic. The children are preparing to write a letter to the Prime Minister to persuade him to spend more money on global aid for causes such as earthquakes, tornadoes and tsunamis. The children have started to plan what they are going to write in their letters, linking together what they have learnt in History, Geography and English this half term so far.

In Maths, the children have been working extremely hard on their arithmetic and the results are showing. We have learnt how to find the mean number and started to look deeper at calculating and converting measurements.

In PSHE, the children discussed with their teachers about gangs, they looked at a number of scenarios to decide if they were good or bad. The children thought about different types of gangs such as friendships groups or gangs that make illegal choices. The children were very good at identifying the differences.

In Computing, the children have started their online safety topic. We started looking at cyberbullying and what constitutes as cyberbullying. We also discussed how it is everyone's responsibility to be 'defenders' of bullying and report anything they have witnessed, both online and in person.

Next week, we are doing our final practice SATs before the real ones. Whilst they are working so hard, we want to remind the children that the SATs are just four days of their year 6 experience. We want them to remain as relaxed as possible.
