The parents workshops will look at the online world and how our young people are using it. How they are navigating around restrictions and using the internet without the parents knowledge.

We will explore how all our young people are being influenced on line and forming ideologies and views that might be diametric to their parents, which can also give them a different view of the world. We also look how influencers work, which can lead our children to conduct dangerous dares and challenges
