What is 1, 2, 3 Magic?

- At Kents Hill Junior School, we use 1, 2, 3 Magic as our whole school behaviour policy.
- All staff across the school have had the same level of training to ensure it is **consistently** used by all staff.
- As a result of the policy, our behaviour in the school has improved.
- We share the expectations with the children at the beginning of each term. There are **no hidden expectations**.
- The reason it goes up to 3 is it provides children with an opportunity to correct their behaviour, these are gentle reminders.
- **All children begin each lesson or new setting at 0.** Our lessons last from 15-60 minutes. This resets each time.
- What does the 'Magic' mean in 1, 2, 3 Magic? The magic is having a school that has a calm learning environment where children know how to behave and demonstrate positive learning behaviours throughout lessons.

Managing a class of 30 children is a challenging job: our teachers ensure that children are not disturbed by low-level behaviour by giving children a 1, 2, or 3 for certain behaviours:

At the end of every term, there is going to be a reward for the 'always' children who do not get a 1, 2 or a 3.

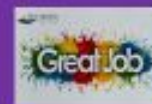
Miss Parkes or Mr Tipper will take these children out for a treat.

1,2,3 Magic!

- Two 3s in a week means loss of breaktime or lunchtime and a phone call home.
- Three 2s in a week means loss of breaktime or lunchtime and a phone call home.
- Over seven 1s in a week means loss of breaktime or lunchtime.

Rewards at KHJS:

- Dojo winners who receive an ice lolly or hot chocolate with marshmallows and an extra break
- Golden Time once a week
- Weekly opportunity to be awarded a 'Golden Ticket' for being RRS
- Weekly opportunities to receive a 'Great Job' postcard in assembly
- Music on a Friday lunchtime if our 97% attendance target is hit
- RRS nominations where children recognise others successes every half term
- Every month, children are recognised for 'Best things I've seen this month' board.
- 'Always' children treat every term
- Times table badges
- Always, Always, Always treat at the end of the year for any child who did not get a 1, 2 or 3 for the whole year!

What does my child need to bring to school?

Spellings - Common Exception Words and spelling lists revision throughout the term with the sheet provided by the class teacher.

Times Tables Rockstars: 20 minutes a week online.

Reading at home each evening and signed in the reading record.

Reading scrapbook – A child each week will be chosen to complete the reading scrapbook. More information will come out about this when it is the turn of your child to take it home.

Curriculum Homework: Teachers will be setting reading and research tasks for pupils on an online platform call ‘Curriculum Visions’ which you can log into from home. This is a fantastic website to help pupils learn more about a range of topics. In addition to the tasks their teachers direct them to read, pupils can freely search for other topics they are interested in from home, even if we are not studying them in school. 






At KHJS, we are committed to helping our children grow into confident, kind, and well-rounded individuals.

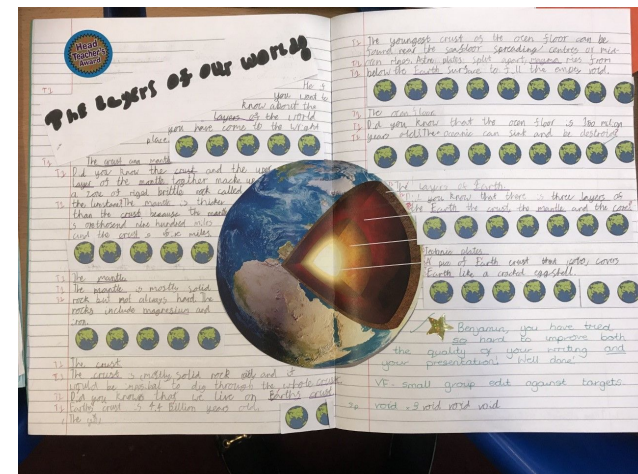
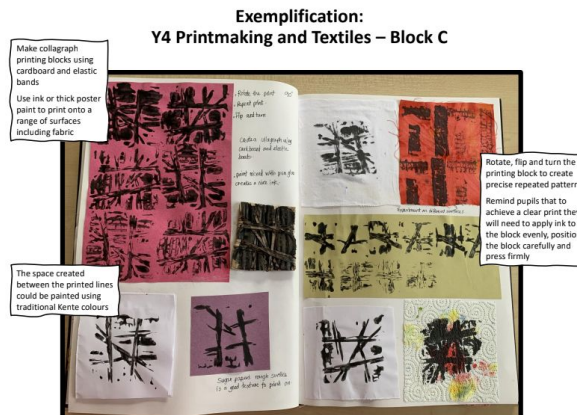
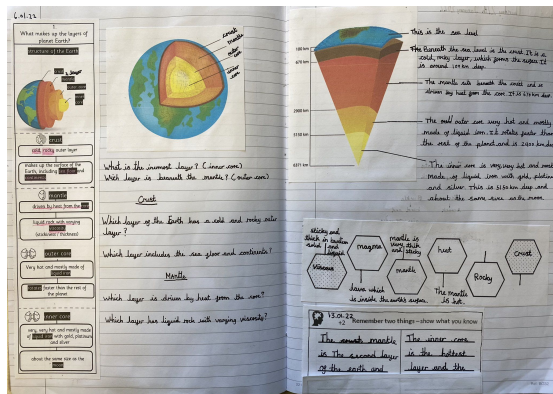
Curriculum

We're delighted to be using the **Curriculum with Unity Schools Partnership (CUSP)** for subjects such as **French, Art & Design, Science, Music, Design & Technology, Religious Education, Geography, and History.**

CUSP is an *evidence-based, research-informed curriculum* that has been carefully designed to promote **sequenced progression, explicit vocabulary instruction, and memory-strengthening techniques** like spaced retrieval and interleaving—helping learners truly retain and build on knowledge over time.

This means each lesson isn't just a one-off but builds logically on previous learning, giving pupils a stronger foundation and deeper understanding

Enrichment

Online Safety

As children become more independent, their online activity grows – from games and YouTube to messaging apps. Many children send and receive a **large number of messages daily**, and these are often **not checked by adults**. This can sometimes lead to unkind behaviour, misunderstandings, or exposure to content they shouldn't see.

How parents can help:

- **Talk regularly** – make online safety part of everyday conversations.
- **Check in** – look at messages with your child, and discuss how to respond safely and kindly.
- **Set boundaries** – agree on screen time, device-free times (like bedtime), and which apps are appropriate.
- **Remind them** – only talk to people they know in real life and never share personal details.
- **Model good habits** – show positive, balanced use of technology yourself.
